

# Election 2024: Ten Ways You Can Help Make it Successful

#### 1. Sign up as a poll worker

Receive a small stipend

 Learn how the voting process works

Assist people with voting

 Set an example for your friends and family!





#### 2. Serve as a bilingual poll worker


- U.S. citizens and legal permanent residents are eligible to serve as poll workers in California
- Most counties face a shortage of bilingual poll workers
- Visit <u>www.helpamericavote.gov</u> to sign up to serve as a poll worker





#### 3. Be an informed voter

- Review your ballot and state and county voter information guides before filling out your ballot
- Visit <u>www.calvoter.org</u> to find reliable nonpartisan election info
- It's OK to skip contests if you're not sure how to vote – the important thing is to be a voter!
- Make a plan to vote what day, which method, which location – and do your voting homework ahead of time





#### 4. Share reliable information with others

- Help stop misinformation and disinformation by not spreading it
- Use the SIFT rule before reposting anything
- Remember the old saying: "If it bleeds it leads" – don't be manipulated by fear or emotional reactions to headlines
- Consider volunteering as an election observer to help accurately inform others about the voting process



### 5. Help a friend or first-time voter vote! Make sure they:

- Are registered to vote at their current address
- Get a ballot and election materials from the state and their county
- Understand how to fill out the ballot and the vote by mail envelope
- Have a plan to vote
- Offer to go with them to vote in person
- Take a picture of your friend wearing their "I voted" sticker and celebrate them on social media!



### 6. Make sure you, your friends and family are registered to vote

• Visit <u>voterstatus.sos.ca.gov</u> on the Secretary of State's web site to look up your voter registration record or complete an online application.

 Californians must register by October 21 to ensure they get a ballot in the mail for the Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> election; after that date you can still register and vote at a voting site before or on Election Day.

 Contact your county election office if you have questions.



#### 7. Host a Ballot Party

- Invite friends and family over to your place to review your ballots together a few weeks before Election Day
- Assign participants specific contests or ballot propositions to study in advance and find out which people or groups are supporting and opposing the propositions and candidates
- Provide snacks and drinks
- Have printed and online resources available official voter information guides, reliable online sources like calvoter.org
- It's OK if people disagree sometimes that helps you make decisions too!





### 8. Ask your employer to inform workers of their voting rights

- Employers are required under California law to give employees up to two hours of paid time off work on Election Day to vote
- Employees must request time off at least two business days before Election Day (Friday, Nov. 1)
- Notices from the Secretary of State are available in multiple languages at www.sos.ca.gov/elections/timevote-notices





#### 9. Celebrate and Promote Civic Holidays

- National Poll Worker Recruitment Day: August 1
- Voter Registration Day: September 17
- Voter Education Week: October 7 11
- Early Voting Day: October 28
- Election Hero Day: November 4






#### 10. Vote and urge others to vote!
